In a slight change to our regular 'first Wednesday Members Meetings' we have the opportunity to visit the Purity Brewery again.

The brewery tour was one of the first trips organised after Mike took over Take Flight ... almost 10 years ago. In fact the total number of members in the club at that time filled the 12 seater we went in!

The event takes place on Tuesday February 3rd. Initially it will be open to members only due to limited places (20).

The price is £22.50 (plus a £2.00 booking fee) and includes lots of beer and a hearty home-cooked meal from the farmer's wife.



"**Purity**" is a rural bespoke brewery whose unique beers are still made in the traditional way within a thoroughly modern and environmentally-friendly brewery...

The evening tour will take you through the **Purity** story over a pint of their award winning ales. With a brief talk about the founding principles of **Purity** and a brief discussion of brewing history which provides a background against which you can then enjoy the tour of their "state of the art" brewhouse and wetland system.

Please be aware we are on a working farm and need to respect the farmers land.



Sensible shoes are recommended especially when visiting the brewery and wetland system

Evening starts at 7.30pm. Car park is signposted. Entrance to the visitor centre is through the courtyard not the shop. Tour ends at 10.pm.
